PROJECT A

BUDGET

- Seeds \$100
- Gardening Tools (rakes, shovels, watering cans, wheelbarrows)

- Wood for fencing \$150
- Snacks and water for youth working on the garden \$100

BUDGET

- Booking a room \$75

- Decorations for the room \$50

PROJECT A

My brother and I would like to take a few of the youth in our community out on to the land to teach them basic hunting and trapping skills and basic survival skills. We would teach them traditional hunting and trapping that was passed down to us from our grandfather. We also want to show them how the skin the animals and cook the meat. We will be sharing what we hunted with our community and gifting it to our Elders.

BUDGET

- Food and water \$300
- Snares and traps \$300
- Oil lamps and oil \$100
- Tents and first aid kits \$300

About 8 to 9 of us can go

There is a lack of awareness about youth mental health support services. We would like to develop a website that can direct youth to resources and program as well as a portal to connect with other youth who are sharing similar experiences. The site will have links to existing programs and organizations that offer support to youth experiencing mental health concerns. There will also be a chat board and conferencing days for youth to get together and talk to each other about their own lived experiences. We will also be sharing content and videos from youth who would like to share their stories on our website for other youth to help their own self healing journeys.

BUDGE

- Fees for web developer \$450
- ZOOM conferencing for online get togethers \$100
- Camera for filming youth stores \$100
- Editing software for films and content creation \$150

PROJECT A

My team and I would like to run a music camp for youth with disabilities. There are not many opportunities like this in our community but there is great interest for it. We would invite local musicians and music teachers to host a different instrument a day and talk about their passion for music. We're planning to have about 100 youth participate in the camp.

BUDGET

- Venue \$300
- Instrument rentals \$500
- Food & drink \$200
- Creative materials for activities \$300
- Honorariums for the workshop leaders (8) \$800

We will be working in a team of 10 people putting this camp together PROJECT DATES

PROJECT B

A STEM workshop series for youth in my community. We have a high population of minority and low income households, with many of the youth being between the ages of 10 and 15. Our series will be targeted at this age group, with a science fair and robotics competition at the end of the workshop series. All the workshops and competitions will be free and open to anyone who is interested in participating. My team and I will be working with science and tech teachers to help build the workshop content and judge the competitions.

BUDGET

- Workshop materials (notebooks, pencils, geometry sets, pens)
 \$350
- Snacks for workshops (granola bars, water bottles, crackers etc.) –
 \$150 Community centre room booking for workshops and competitions 8 events x \$60 per booking \$480
- Honorariums for judges and workshop leaders \$650 (about \$100 each) Trophies for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners \$150
